TE WAKA UNUA SCHOOL

ENROLMENT SCHEME

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school. The boundaries shall be both sides of all the following streets as shown in the attached map.

From the Intersection of Aldwins Road and Bass Street,

East on Bass Street to Randolph Street,

South on Randolph Street to Matlock Street (including the Eastern end of Bass Street and Edmond Street),

South east on Matlock Street to Smith Street (including Mackworth Street to house numbers 63 and 64, and Okeover Street),

North on Smith Street to Arran Crescent (including 59 Smith Street),

East on Arran Crescent, then north east on Arran Courts to Bute Street,

East on Bute Street to Tilford Street,

South on Tilford Street to Compton Street (including Pioneer Lane),

East on Compton Street to Hargood Street (including Frensham Crescent),

South west on Hargood Street to Glenroy Street (including Hargood Street to

Linwood Avenue, Thistledown Place and Oban Place),

South east on Glenroy Street to Portman Street (including the northern portion of Portman Street and Peckham Lane),

South west on Portman Street to Ferry Road,

North west on Ferry Road to Radley Street (including Heathcote Street to house number 11),

South west on Radley Street to Cumnor Terrace,

South on Cumnor Terrace to Sheldon Street (including 57 and 59 Cumnor Terrace),

West on Sheldon Street to the intersection with Clarendon Terrace,

North west across the footbridge to the intersection of Richardson Terrace and Mackenzie Avenue.

North west on Mackenzie Avenue to the intersection with Ensors Road,

North west to the eastern end of Charles Street,

North west on Charles Street to Wilsons Road,

North on Wilsons Road to Ferry Road,

West on Ferry Road to Phillips Street,

North on Phillips Street to Tuam Street,

East on Tuam Street to Olivers Road / Harrow Street Intersection,

South East on Harrow Street to Bordesley Street,

South west on Bordesley Street to Ferry Road,

South east on Ferry Road to Aldwins Road, (including all addresses on Ryan Street)

North on Aldwins Road to Bass Street.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Special Programme

The school operates the following special programme: *Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui*.

Students who live within the school's home zone and meet the criteria for enrolment in Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui will be enrolled ahead of out of zone students. Numbers for Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui are limited. The total number of places in Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui will be determined by the Principal after consultation with the Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui teachers.

The criteria for acceptance into Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui are as follows:

- 1. All prospective students must demonstrate a proficiency in Te Reo Māori and a commitment to Tikanga as assessed by the Kaiwhakahaere or other nominated staff of Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui. Proficiency, previous experience and commitment will be assessed during a whanau interview prior to acceptance into the programme. Following the interview staff will meet to discuss the whanau commitment to the programme and assess the student's suitability and likelihood of success in the programme prior to a position being offered.
- 2. For students who meet the proficiency requirement in (1) above, priority for acceptance into the programme is in the following order:
 - 1) Applicants residing within the home zone and with siblings attending Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui.
 - 2) Applicants residing in the home zone.
 - 3) Applicants residing outside the home zone with siblings currently attending Te Whānau Puawai o Ngākaunui.
 - 4) Applicants with extended whanau connections (eg cousins).
 - 5) All other applicants.
- 3. If there are more applicants in any priority group than places available, a ballot will be conducted.

Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

The order of priority in which applicants who live outside a school's home zone are to be offered places at the school is as follows:

- (a) first priority must be given to any applicant who is accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school:
- (b) second priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school:
- (c) third priority must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school:
- (d) **fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school:
- (e) **fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school:
- (f) sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
